A Message from our Mayor

This month I have three separate topics I would like to address. First, **vandalism and our efforts to prevent ongoing issues**. Every summer we have reports of vandalism in our parks—especially in the restrooms. The toilets are blown up; graffiti shows up on the walls; and even worse, the restrooms get purposely desecrated with human excrement. These senseless acts not only cost taxpayer dollars, but also divert our parks staff from their regular duties. To combat this issue, we have been working with surveillance companies to install HD cameras with night vision in our parks. Last week, our selected provider began the installation process. These cameras will help deter vandalism and identify those responsible. Please remind your kids that these cameras are now operational.



Second, we are **committed to transparency** in how tax dollars are spent. Councilwoman Chrissy Hannemann, along with our staff and input from citizens on the finance committee, has created a **Citizen’s Budget** for the previous fiscal year. You can view it at www.alpineut.gov/CitizensBudget or use the QR code below. As we go through this next budget season (April–June) our goal is to provide updates by August so all the residents can see how our tax dollars are being spent across each fiscal year.

Finally, I want to make you aware of and encourage your participation in the upcoming **Bunny Run for Morgan**, organized by our Alpine Youth Council. This 1-mile run will take place on **Saturday, April 19, at 9 AM at Creekside Park**. The suggested donation is **\$10 per person**, with all proceeds benefiting the **Hodson/Hughes family**. This event honors Morgan Hodson Hughes, daughter of our very own Lone Peak Fire Captain Brian Hodson. Tragically, Morgan passed away Dec 28, 2024, just 9 days after giving birth to twins. 

Spring Burn Permits



Spring open burn is allowed from April 1 – May 31 but a **PERMIT IS REQUIRED**. This 60-day period is for burning yard waste and tree trimmings. Forecasting is only available for a 3-day window but multiple 3-day air quality permits can be completed during the 60-day permit window if needed.

Before burning, check that the current air clearing index is greater than 500 (air.utah.gov). We urge those intending to burn yard waste to exercise extreme caution, form small piles, create adequate fire breaks between other fuels, and never leave a fire unattended.

WHAT CAN I BRING?

Tree limbs , shrubbery, grass clippings, building materials, furniture, limited appliances, household items, any green yard waste.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

Sod, dirt, rocks, treated wood, animal waste, construction debris, lithium-ion batteries, anything with freon, hazardous materials, batteries, tanks, drums, barrels, refrigerators, mattresses, box springs, railroad ties, concrete, toxic or flammable materials, tires, dead animals, liquid or septic loads, abandoned or discarded automobiles, motorcycles, scooters, and motorized vehicles.

2025 Election Information:

Serve Your Community! Alpine City will hold a Municipal Election on November 4, 2025, for the following offices:

- Mayor (4-year term)
- Two (2) City Council seats (4-year term)

To qualify for candidacy, you must:

- ◆ Be a U.S. citizen
- ◆ Be a registered voter
- ◆ Be a resident of Alpine for 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the election
- ◆ Be mentally competent
- ◆ Have no felony or treason convictions

Declaration of Candidacy forms or Nomination Petitions must be filed in person with the City Recorder at Alpine City Hall (20 N. Main Street) **between Monday, June 2 and Friday, June 6**. Office hours are 8:00am to 5:00pm. You may also file remotely or through a designated agent if you are outside the state during the entire filing period.

If necessary, the Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 12. To obtain a candidacy form or ask any questions, contact the City Recorder at 801-756-6347, ext. 3, or email dparry@alpineut.gov.



Save the Date: Memorial Day Ceremony

Residents and friends of Alpine are invited to attend the Alpine City Memorial Day Ceremony on **Monday, May 26, 2024 at 8:00 am** at the Alpine City Cemetery. This is an opportunity to join together and honor the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military, and also honor our living military veterans.

The military-style ceremony will feature an honor guard raising the flag to half mast, a military chaplain offering remarks and a non-denominational prayer, recognition of Alpine’s living veterans, a military medley sing-along led by the Alpine Youth Council, remarks from a military speaker, and “Taps” to honor the fallen.

Light refreshments will follow, with an opportunity to meet and speak with our Alpine veterans. Expressing your gratitude with a simple “Thank you for serving for me” is always appropriate and appreciated. Veterans are encouraged to wear any uniform or military memorabilia they have. There is no uniform requirement—wear what you have and let people know who you are!

Renewals or Registrations—In January, the Building Department sent out reminders to renew your Accessory Apartment permits. These registered units help Alpine City meet our state Moderate Income Housing requirements. We are pleased that **61** of our **Most Responsible Citizens** paid their fees by the deadline.

If you are not among the few, the proud, the paid-in-full (that’s **79** of you), we encourage compliance this week. Please note that failure to do so will **not** result in our Code Officer evicting your mother-in-law from the apartment. (*You might consider buying your children a large drum set.*) If you are no longer renting your apartment, please let us know.

Watering Schedule for 2025

Similar to previous years, watering is only allowed during certain times and days as follows:

Odd numbered house numbers—Mon, Wed, Fri *

Even numbered house numbers—Tue, Thu, Sat*

Watering hours are from 7pm to 7am. For example, odd house numbers may begin watering at 7pm on Monday and must be completed by 7am on Tuesday. Even house numbers may begin watering at 7pm on Tuesday and must be completed by 7am on Wednesday, etc.

City parks, schools, churches, and agricultural users will be on a different schedule. In order to balance the use and maintain adequate pressure, they may be watering during the day.

*You are not obligated to water 3 times a week, only water when needed. Some have found better results watering 2 times a week for longer periods. Please delay watering until it is necessary.

Pressurized Irrigation (PI)

Water will be turned on between **APRIL 10–15**. Please make sure your main PI valve is closed by April 10th to prevent potential flooding from undetected leaks that may have developed over the winter.



As a reminder, all residents without PI are required to install a Reduced Pressure Zone (RPZ) assembly (backflow) and have it inspected annually, ideally by May 31st.

Code Compliance Corner—Don Quigley, Code Compliance Officer

This winter, the need for snow removal has been lower than in past years. However, we appreciate everyone who has followed the **No Parking Overnight** ordinance, allowing our snowplow drivers to work more safely and efficiently. Starting **April 1st**, overnight street parking is once again permitted—**unless** a late spring snowfall requires plowing. In that case, the ordinance remains in effect until streets are cleared. Please monitor the weather and avoid parking on the street during snowstorms so plows can operate effectively.

Year-Round Street Parking & Ordinances

In addition to seasonal parking rules, please remember these regulations that apply all year:

1. **48-Hour Parking Limit:** Vehicles, trailers, boats, or RVs cannot remain parked in the same spot on the street for more than **48 hours**. As you prepare for seasonal vehicle use, remember that you must move them within that time period.
2. **Sidewalk & Driveway Obstruction:** Parking any vehicle or trailer in a way that blocks a sidewalk or driveway is illegal.
3. **Street Obstructions:** Placing dirt piles, dumpsters, or palleted items on the street—even temporarily—is prohibited. **Violations carry a \$500 fine per occurrence.** Deliveries must be placed on your own property, not on the street.

Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our streets safe and accessible!

Cemetery Corner—Commonly asked questions

Where is the headstone we ordered? Headstones are placed at the cemetery from April to October to prevent damage to the grounds by heavy trucks during the rainy, snowy months. Monument companies work with the city to have headstones installed by Memorial Day. (We are sorry to inform you that using a blow dryer to fluff the grass will not accelerate your installation.)

Why is the grass missing on my loved one's plot? It all depends upon the outdoor temperature on the day of the burial. Frozen turf often falls apart, which makes it impossible to re-install. If this happens, the soil will be compacted and smoothed out. Our team strives to have every new grave covered in happy sod before Memorial Day.

Why does the grass on yonder grave look better than our spot? Many factors affect lawn cheerfulness, such as soil composition, slope, and hours of shade and sun. City workers do their best to maintain beautiful grounds. We ask that you do not bring your neighbor's cow to the cemetery to provide organic fertilizer. (The mowing crew has especially strong feelings about this one.)
