Alpine City in partnership with Highland City received a grant from Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) to conduct a study and create an Active Transportation Plan (ATP) for our cities. This grant will cover 93.3% the total cost of the study. Horrocks Engineers was awarded the contract and will be performing the study. The goals of the Active transportation Plan study is to make our streets safer and provide pathways for our pedestrians, bikers and equestrians; while also evaluating how to best connect to our neighboring communities. Horrocks is conducting a survey to gather the priorities for our residents. We want as many people to participate as possible and request your feedback. This is a plan for you and our community. Please take the 5 minutes to be part of this process and let your concerns and priorities be considered. 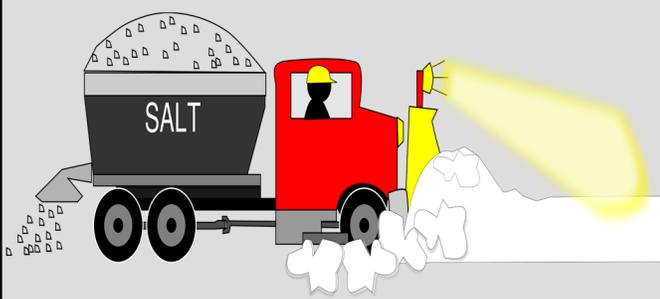


SANTA IS COMING TO TOWN!

WINTER PARKING

It is time to think about snow because we hope to receive some. From December 1 through March 31 vehicles are not allowed on the street from MID-NIGHT to 8:00 a.m. and anytime snow is present. Refer to Alpine City Municipal Code 11-346.

Another problem in the winter is when residents push snow from their property onto the street. This snow freezes and damages plows when they run into it. Alpine City code reads "It is unlawful for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited any snow upon any city street on the travel portion. It is also unlawful for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited any snow in such a manner as to obstruct a public sidewalk."

You may want to know which streets are plowed first. The arterial and collector streets are given first priority. These roads include, but are not limited to: Main Street, Canyon Crest, Westfield/ 200 North and Grove Drive. Next are the main residential streets, such as Ridge Drive, Healey Boulevard, Long Drive, 300 North and 400 West. Local residential streets are next, with cul-de-sacs plowed last.

Each kit will enable to average homeowner to line their frontage, while additional kits may be necessary for those living on corner lots, or those wishing to extend to their front door. Do you have a water leak?

With the installation of the new meters, you may now get an app on your phone or use your computer to monitor your daily water use. It will also alert you if you have a leak, which will save you \$ and precious water.

To sign up on your computer, go to EyeOneWater.com and create an account using your zip code and your Alpine City account #, which is on your water bill. Use all the numbers but don't type the decimal point. (account 382.7 would be 3827)

To get the app on your phone, go to your App Store and search for Eye On Water. Choose the one that says "Making Water Visible" with the blue water droplet. Get the app, Install app, Open, Sign Up, Enter zip code and account # (no decimal point), Continue, Yes, that's me, Create account, enter email, create password, accept account terms, Verify email. Go to your email, find the one from Eye On Water, click Verify My Email, Enable notifications.
